## Short, Successful Indoor Campaign for Wilkinson

I have never been a fan of indoor walking races\* on banked tracks. The tracks tend to be 200m which results in multi-lapping from quite an early stage of the race and maneuvering sideways up and down the banked track makes the maintenance of good technique difficult if not impossible. \*I can see the benefits of winter training on indoor tracks using just lane one.

Nevertheless indoor races do provide walkers with a welcome diversion from the winter grind of preparing for a new season and it is an excellent platform from which to expose the event to a broader athletic audience.

Callum Wilkinson included a brief three race programme in his demanding winter training schedule and was well pleased with it; winning the London Games 3km, setting an age group national best performance for one mile and collecting a silver medal in the British championships. *More details in Results Round-up*

## ***Results Round-up***

This year the **London Indoor Games 3km** and 1km walks at LVAC on 25<sup>th</sup> January incorporated race 3 of the UKA Winter Challenge series. It was uplifting to see so many young walkers on the track and a pity that being the first event of the day, there wasn't more spectators to see that race walking isn't the exclusive domain of older athletes. Nine walkers took part in the 1000m and 16 in the 3km of which eight were under 20.

Callum Wilkinson interrupted his winter training schedule to compete and the manner of his victory; he started lapping the field after only three laps finally clocking 12.28.62, suggests that his winter preparation for 2015 is going well.

Luc Legon 13.52 was second and Francisco Reis close behind in 13.55. The brothers Snook; Tim 14.14 and Chris 14.52 occupied the next places with Sophie Ward the leading lady just behind in 14.53. *Leaguers* Steve Allen 15.49, Malcom Martin 15.59 and Angela Martin 20.09 also took part.

Lucy Ward and Evie Butcher headed the under 15 1km clocking 5.02 and 5.05 respectively - excellent times. George Wilkinson was the only boy in the u15 1000m and he recorded 6.38.39.

**Steining 15km** – 14<sup>th</sup> January. Sean Pender was the only club member among the 13 starters at this event along with *Leaguers* Trevor Jones 80.08 in second place, Steve Allen 4<sup>th</sup> equal with Jim Ball 85.08, Dan Maskell 7<sup>th</sup> in 96.17 and Anne Jones runner-up lady in 100.22.

Ron Penfold reports: Some good times were recorded due to the favourable weather conditions; Ian Richards, last year's winner, won a again, but in a faster time. An excellent result of note was from U20 Emma Achurch who travelled from Leicester to use this undulating out and back tough course as part of her training routine, she went off with Ian and although she dropped back a little by halfway she came back at Ian over the last kilometres to almost beat him, their times being 73.43 and 73.52.

Having been priced out at Victoria Park, this year's **London Walks** were staged at the Hillingdon Cycle Circuit on 8<sup>th</sup> February. For some reason or other there was a dearth of senior walkers, as indeed there was for the Essex and Eastern indoor championships being held on the same day at LVAC.

On the positive side 21 of the 39 walkers were under 20, some showing distinct promise. None more so that Emma Achurch who after crossing the line to win the junior 5km in 24.15 speeded up to clock 48.28 for 10km.

Young Tim Snook 52.16 was the first male walker to finish and the official race winner ahead of *Leaguers* Trevor Jones 52.51, Jim Ball 55.32, Steve Allen 55.42, John Hall 56.31, Dan Maskell 63.58, Sean Pender the only Enfield walker 66.27, Michael Harran 67.01, Russell Vroobel surprisingly the only Hillingdon walker 69.50 and Dave Hoben 73.47. *Leaguers* in the women's 5km who like Emma went on to record times at 10km were Maureen Noel 31.22/64.03 and Anne Jones 31.36/ 65.17. Sean Pender won the Centurions award.

In the **Eastern Counties Indoor championships** staged at Lee Valley on 8<sup>th</sup> February, Callum Wilkinson broke the national under 20 One mile walk best performance of 6.09.2 set by Leicester's Phil Vesty (who went on to become an Olympian) back in 1982.

The field was disappointingly small and the young Suffolk walker was soon lapping everyone else on the track. He passed the half-way point in 3.03.15 and encouraged by an appreciative crowd maintained his pace to record 6.03.78. The other walkers were; Steve Allen 8.13.69 Keith Palmer 10.26 and Pamela Abbott 10.38.41. George Wilkinson set a pb of 10.58.41 in the u15 mile.

There were no club walkers in the **Cambridge Harriers Winter League 5km** at Bexley 14<sup>th</sup> February, where the event was won by Ian Richards 24.37 from Jon and Chris Hobbs 24.53 and 25.18 respectively. However, the *League* was well represented with six walkers among the 17 senior starters; Malc Martin 26.46, John Hall 26.54, Dan Maskell 30.56, Shaun Lightman 34.25, Mick Barnbrook 37.26 and Dave Ainsworth 40.55.

Callum Wilkinson rounded off his brief indoor season on a high note at the **British championships** staged at the EIS, Sheffield, on 15<sup>th</sup> February with a silver medal in the senior 3km walk, clocking a season's best of 12.24.34 in the process.

Tom Bosworth 11.30.35 was an impressive winner breaking the stadium record with a time of 11.30.35. Wilkinson was the only athlete to try and match Bosworth's pace, but had to let him go after the first kilometre. Canadian Creighton Connolly caught and passed Wilkinson with 600m to go, but couldn't respond to the Enfield walker's final surge over the last lap. Although guest Connolly 12.45.44 finished third, the bronze medal went to Bosworth's young Tonbridge team mate Guy Thomas 13.01.60.

Francisco Reis also competed and despite giving away up to 35 years to most of the 10 competitors, gave a good account of himself clocking 13.57.91
