Double Gold Standard

Enfield & Haringey's Arthur Thomson(M75) was one of four British walkers to record individual double gold medal performances in the European Veteran's Non-Stadia championships in Belgium over the weekend of 13th/15th May.

Anne Wheeler W55 and Leaguers Noel Blatchford (W60) along with John Hall (M60).were the others. The women's distances were 10km/20kms, the men 10km/30km.

Other Leaguer's also in the medals were Cath Duhig W55 with double silver, Diane Bradley (W45) and Ken Bobbett (M65) with 20km/30km bronzes respectively. Anne Wheeler and Cath were backed up by Anne Belchambers (W55) and the three of them collected team gold awards.

There were several other Leaguer's at the championships and full results appears on the RaceWalkUK website.

Results Round-up

The **Essex** 10km race was held on 7th May at Ashtons track, Woodford. Steve Uttley 54.45 retained his title. Alan O’Rawe 68.47 and Chris Bent 70.31 occupied the minor placings; Mick Barnbrook 73.18 and Phil Banard who retired injured were the other Essex competitors. The race was open to guests and first to cross the line was Ian Richards 52.01 and behind Steve Uttley came Steve Allen 60.57 and Helen Middleton 61.12.

The European non-stadia championships being staged in France over the same weekend as the county 3km championships (14/15 May) affected some results. Newcomer to walking Mikk Bradley 17.24 won the **Middlesex** title from Sean Pender 17.59, Ron Powell 19.48, Norma Grimsey 20.05 (women’s champion) and Bernie Hercocock 22.17. At Ipswich, in the **Suffolk** event Alan Ellam 16.36, Angie Alstrachan 18.11, Linda Spinks 20.50 were the senior walkers in action, but three YAGS competed over 1km; U15 Ben Eames 6.17, Seb Anthony 6.17 and U13 James Nichols 6.49

On Monday 9th May at LVAC the first **SCVAC (N.NM Div)** track league got underway with a 2km walk which was won by Fransisco Reis 9.15 from Steve Uttley 9.47 and Steve Allen 10.05. Seventeen finished, among them Sean Pender 11.52, Norma Grimsey 12.50, Ron Powell 13.02, Bernie Hercocock 14.14 and Ken Livermore 15.31.

The Midlands easily won the **Inter-Area match at Tamworth** on 22nd May with seventy-two points. The South with only four walkers to contest eleven events finished a woeful third, forty points behind the winners and twenty adrift of the North. For the South, Heather Butcher 15.47 won the u15 3km and Ian Richards 51.07 the senior 10km. whilst Helen Middleton 29.19 finished third in the Senior women’s 3km and Cath Cotterill 32.04 fourth in the 5km.

As one would expect amid the splendour and tradition of The Mall and Buckingham Palace, there was a special atmosphere for the **UKA 20km/Junior 10km championships**. The race was the last in an ‘Olympic test day’ which included road running events. Over fifty walkers took part and in addition to three disqualifications, a further seven were unable to complete the distance because they were outside the time limit. Nevertheless, all have the satisfaction of knowing that in years to come, they actually competed on the 2012 Olympic course. Club members along with several *Leaguer’s* who were able to add this experience to their CV were Arthur Thomson 2.02.12 and Helen Middleton 2.04.10. The event winners were Jo Jackson 91.50 and China’s Wang Zhen 84.24. Ben Wears 90.32, Dan King 90.40 and Alex Wright 91.42 were the leading Brits to finish in seventh, eighth and ninth positions.

Steve Allen won both **VAC’s five mile races** staged at Batterersea Park; 31st May (14 starters) in 47.15 and on 14th June (13 starters) 45.42. For EHAC at the first fixture, Sean Pender 49.58 was second, Ron Powell 54.24 was ninth and at the second race Arthur Thomson 47.54 was runner up, Sean Pender 49.27 third, Ron Powell 55.23 again occupying ninth place, Barbara Edlin 59.52 second of the two women and Bernie Hercocock 61.49 was eleventh.

Only fourteen competitors contesting nine categories faced the starter at the **BMAF 10km track championships** held at Horspath, Oxford on 5th June, the day after the Moulton five. Among them were Steve Allen, Trevor Jones, Cath Duhig and Anne Belchambers, racing for the third time in seven days; following outings at the Mall and Moulton five. There were championship victories for Trevor M50 - 54.58, Steve M55 – 56.38 along with W55 silver and bronze medals for Cath in 51.00 and Anne 63.32. *Leaguers* Micky Harran M70 – 63.26 and Noel Blatchford W60 – 63.41 also won their categories.

The first of the 2011 **Woodford Tuesday** track walks on 7th June attracted fourteen entries and Fransisco Reis was less than a second away from ducking under fourteen minutes for 3km. The Steve Allens; of Barnet 15.52 and Ilford 16.25 were followed in fourth place by Sean Pender 18.31. Bernie Hercocock was eleventh and clocked 22.10.

The following evening Fransisco ensured a sub fourteen minute 3km by shooting through the first lap in 1.40 at the **VAC 3km championship** held at Willesdon. His final time was 13.51 and in his wake were Steve Uttley 15.05 and Arthur Thomson 17.35. Sean Pender 18.04 was sixth.

Arthur Thomson now seventy-five, followed up his double gold in the European non-stadia championships with another double in the **BMAF 3km and 5km track championships** at Birmingham on 25/26th June. The races were over 3km and 5km and his times were 17.10/29.46.

Following Arthur’s example were Helen Middleton W45- 17.32/30.00 and Sue Barnett W60 – 18.35/32.08. Ron Powell M75 – 19.23/33.33 was runner up to Arthur in both races, Rod Dunn M55 – 17.37 was second in the 3km, the only race he contested and Peter Howard M65 – 20.30 was third in the 3km. Sue’s (*No 1 pictured with Jo Miles*) 3km time was yet another personal best.

Only twenty walkers participated in the two events and with M50 Steve Uttley 15.03/26.10, M55 Steve Allen 15.40/27.55 and M60 John Hall 15.35/26.55 also collecting double gold’s along with double runners up W45 Maureen Noel 8.01/31.00 and W55Cath Duhig 18.28/30.44, *Leaguer’s* made up half of the field
