National 50 km – 53 Years on

In the 1959 national 50km championship held at Baddesley Colliery, Warwickshire, Arthur Thomson was the fourth scorer in the winning Metropolitan WC team. The race was won by Don Thompson, who within a year would be Olympic champion. Arthur finished eighteenth in 5.01.21 forty-nine minutes behind his club-mate. Well, in the 2012~50 km championship staged Colchester on 22^{nd} September, he not only collected another team winner's medal, but an individual silver as well, in spite of going off course during the race, emphasizing yet again his entitlement to the superlative 'Super Vet'. His time on this occasion was 5.42.47 and his back-up man to ensure the team title for EHAC was the much raced SRWA President Sean Pender, who was classified with a time of 6.25.46.

The new 50km champion is the 2010 League champion, Barnet's Steve Allen who won in 5..35.01 and to his credit expressed surprise and some embarrassment at the thought of his name being added to the illustrious list of past winners of this championship. In third place was Leicester's Colin Vesty in 6.03.24. There were three other finishers, all outside the 6h 15min time standard; Alan O'Rawe 6.24.25, Sean and John Constandinou 6.48.06

Maureen Noel 6.01.28 was the only female to better the time standard and was the leading lady for the sixth time in seven years. Maureen, Angie Alstrachen 6.22.17 and Karen Davies 6.43.25, were the only three women to contest the championship.

A Wonderful Year for Dom King

Twenty-nine year old Olympian Dominic King rounded off the greatest year in his walking career, by winning the Colchester Hundred on debut, in his home town in the fast time of 18.13.01. Guido Vermier (RWV Rotterdam) 20.20.29, and Daniel King 20.51.58 filled the minor places. The remarkable Sandra Brown 20.45.03, her twenty-sixth British 100 was third overall and League stalwart Steve Allen (I) achieved a long held ambition and qualified as Centurion Number 1102.

I was one of the doubters that thought the 100 at this stage in their careers would be beyond the twins, but am delighted to be proved wrong. Dom and Dan surely created history by being the first twins to qualify as Centurions in the same race and taking first and second places in a national championship. Well done to both of them, to Steve and the other five qualifiers. A full report is available on the Centurions website

An excellent field of thirty-five contested the event on a sunny, warm autumn afternoon at the Dacorum track, Hemel Hempstead, a new venue so far as the *League* is concerned and feedback since the race has been very complimentary about it. The racing was hard and competitive as the result shows and with such a large field, the recorders deserve special mention.

Ironically, this fixture had been put back a week to avoid the Colchester 100 and so fell on the last Saturday of September which was the traditional date of the famous Highgate Hour Meeting.

Fifteen year old Callum Wilkinson continued his improvement and only six days after becoming the national 50km champion Steve Allen showed little sign of the fatigue he must have had. After the race RWA Vice President Mark Easton presented him with the national 50km trophy.

Results Round-up

The **Jim Sharlott open 10km** promoted by Leicester WC and incorporating the **BMAF** championships was successfully staged at Abbey Park. Leicester, on Sunday 16th September. The overall race winners were Bethan Davies (Cardiff AAC) 52.05 and Mark Williams (Tamworth AC) 50.11. Club and *Leaguer* interests included Helen Middleton 60.26 fourth (1st W45) and Sue Barnett 65.52 eighth (2nd W60) and in the men's race, the Steve's; Uttley 53.12 fourth (1st M55) and Allen (B) 53.59 fifth (2nd M55), Arthur Thomson 55.29 seventh (1st M75, John Hall 55.57 eighth (1st M60), Sean Pender 64.03 and Bernie Hercock 80.31 sixteenth (3rd M75).

There were ten women among the forty-two starters in the annual **PSUK** (**Police/Civil Services**) **championships** and inter-services match held at Cannon Hill Park, Birmingham on 19th September. Steve Uttley (CS) 52.50 and Peter Ryan (P) 55.08 were the individual title winners. The highest placed EHAC competitor was Amos Seddon 59.55 eighth overall and second policeman followed in eleventh by Gary Smith 61.55 and competing as one of five guests in the race, Sean Pender fourteenth in 62.58. In the womens 5km won by Lyn Bradley, club newcomer Pamela Abbott recorded 37.02.

It has been brought to my notice that there was more success for *Leaguer's* at the **European Veterans championships** in Germany last month. Steve Allen (B) writes; that at the European Championships in August the GB results in the M50 20k read like a League finishing order - the old 1-2-3 of Reis, Uttley and Allen taking the team gold. Long may the League flourish, and long may *Leaguers* be encouraged to aim that bit higher and compete in championship races and beyond.

It was very hot (high 30's) in Zagreb when the European Transplant and Dialysis Games were held in August. The winner of the 5km walk was Poland's world champion Miroslaw Burski in 30.11. The heat didn't prevent Steve Whelan collecting the silver medal in 32.45 ahead of world silver medalist in the 5km walk and in the process beating Joaquin Lacon Exposito by two seconds. Steve's next international target is the World Transplant Games in Durban, South Africa, in August 2013 where in cooler conditions he hopes to go one better.

ROUBAIX 24 HOUR RELAY 15/16 September 2012

Cath Duhig reports

Two "GB" teams once again featured in the 24 hour relay event which has become established as part of the 28 Heures walking event over the past few years. Once again the teams were named "The Lightning Ladies" (Les Femmes Éclair) and "The Thunderbolts" (Les Femmes du Foudre), though this year their composition brought wry smile or two as at least one of the "Femmes" was, in fact, un homme. Chris Flint joined Serena Queeney and Sue Rey in The Thunderbolts, while The Lightning Ladies were, as in the previous two years, Kathy Crilley, Norma Grimsey and Cath Duhig. The main target for both teams was to exceed last year's total of kilometres covered in the 24 hours, though as the course had been re-measured, it was more of a case of covering more laps. The Lightnings covered 20 laps apiece, taking it turn on turn over the 3.05kms for the whole period (except the last hour, when the course is shortened to 1km and only one team member can complete the event) to accrue a total in excess of 185kms. The Thunderbolts achieved about 10kms less. Compared with last year, when the heavens opened for most of the event and the abiding memory was of huddling in a leaking tent, this time there were bright skies and plentiful sunshine, making it an altogether more pleasant experience.

Next year will be the 60th anniversary of the Roubaix 28 heures. It would be great if we could "flash mob the event with GB walkers, either individuals or relay teams - the latter being great fun and highly recommended for a great weekend a la française. (Travel with Cath and a visit to the wine warehouse is guaranteed!)
