

Callum Wilkinson won the English Schools Intermediate 5km championship at Birmingham on 21st September. His time of 22.55 was a pb and half a minute quicker than he posted to win the EA u17 title at Bedford earlier in the month. The runner-up and third places were the same as at Bedford; Cameron Corbishley 22.08 and Guy Thomas 22.11 a huge pb.

Senior Alex Eaton (IoM) 22.46 was first to finish in a hotly contested race involving Callum, Cameron and Guy,

who kept close company for over half the distance before first Guy and then with three laps to go Cameron, had to give ground and it wasn't until the last lap that Alex managed to open a short winning lead.

The Girls and Intermediate Girls 3km the finish was even closer. Club mates Heather Butcher 15.08 and Sophie Lewis-Ward 15.10 took their respective titles and Chris Snook the Boys 3km in 15.59. Ellie Dooley was the Senior Girls winner in 25.24 from Jasmine Nicholls 27.25.

It was good to see Trevor Jones in action again after a lengthy injury lay-off and his distance; nearer 7 miles than 6 must have been very pleasing for him.

BMAF News At the BMAF AGM at Birmingham in September Ian Richards was elected as the Federation's Race Walking Secretary. He replaced John Hall who had decided to stand down and paying tribute to him Ian said that "John had built on the successes of previous Secretaries and hands over an excellent program of UK championships and had also been an outstanding international team manager." Ian is delighted that John along with Eric Horwill and Roger Michell have offered their support, because it will enable him to devote some of his time to developing other aspects of Masters' walking.

Ian sees "the biggest challenge is likely to come as a result of pressure which is starting to build for the World Masters Association to either insist on full enforcement of the bent knee rule (ie. No light touch judging on knees if no advantage is being gained) or for the rule to be changed. Application of the former could decimate the numbers of walkers attending international championships and if the latter is applied, the BMAF will almost certainly follow for their championships. This could have significant consequences for race walking in the UK with even more Masters deciding only to race BMAF championships and races under the B rule." He went on to

say that "there are excellent prospects for development both in numbers and in improved levels of performance and over the next few months I hope to announce some new initiatives."

Results Round-up

Under the banner of the 'Lightening Ladies Norma Grimsey along with Suz Beardsmore and Cath Crilley took part in the **Roubaix 24 hour relay** on 14th/15th September. They finished 5th overall covering a distance of 187.976km. Barnet's Steve Allen teamed up with former club member Serena Queeney and Leicester WC's Sue Rey as 'The Thunderbolts' who finished sixth with 181.990km. However, the leading British team was 'The 3 Amigos' - Pat and Dave Evans of Lancs WC and Bill Kingston of Bristol &W AC) who finished second walking between them 194.549km. In the individual 28 hour event, Sandra Brown in twelfth with 200.429km was the highest placed British walker

In the **BMAF track championships** staged at the Alexander Stadium, Birmingham over the weekend of 13th/14th September, Ron Powell (M75) and Pamela Abbott (Wwere the only club members in action and they did so with merit. Ron won his age category 5km in 34.10 and Pamela took second place in both the 3km in 19.49 and the 5km in 35.12. There was however a strong *League* presence with 3/5km double age group victories for Fransisco Reis (M50) 13.57/24.17, Malcolm Martin (M55) 17.06/29.36 and John Hall 15.55/27.30. Angela Martin (W45) scored a golden double with 19.11/32.39 clockings, whilst Cath Duhig (W55) took silver in the 3km with 17.53 and gold in the 5km with 30.49.

Fitzgerald Memorial Walks 21 September 2013 at Tilgate Park, Crawley. Jack Fitzgerald had been a member of SWC for about twenty years, and was a key figure and founder member of Veterans clubs, it is hoped that this dedicated race will be an enduring legacy.

Veterans AC were pleased to have the largest field for some time on a lakeside course once used as the test bed for Britain's water speed record round scenic Campbell's lake.

Conditions were ideal being overcast, mild and windless. Surrey Walking Club had six out of the 15 in the main race over 10km. Recent British Masters record breaker Ian Richards 50.57 of Steyning had a comfortable win, with Portuguese international Francisco Reis 57.07 f Ilford AC and Trevor Jones 57.56 of Steyning AC doing battle for second and third place respectively. There were six ladies over all distances, Steyning AC's triathlete Joan Lennon 59.46 had a really good race coming just inside the hour. *Leaguers* Steve Allen 59.42, Shaun Lightman 63.50, Dan Maskell 64.24, Michael Harran 66.53, David Hoben 74.0, Anne Jones (third woman) 66.55, also supported the main race. There were two supporting races and in one of them it was pleasing to note that the remarkable Anne Lewis was in action.

Surrey WC's **Gazette Cup** over 4 miles was held over a new course at Addington on 6th October in sunny warm conditions. Twenty-three took part in the race which was dominated by sixteen year old Guy Thomas, who as the picture, taken shortly after the start shows cut out the pace from the gun. His winning time over a far from easy course was 32.15, whilst in second place Mark Easton clocked exactly 33 minutes, Trevor Jones 35.14, Luc Legon 36.43, David Crane 37.09 and Malcolm Martin 38.16 made up the first half dozen finishers. Anne Jones 41.52 was the first lady home from Angela Martin 43.42.



The club's representatives were Sean Pender 40.46 in ninth, Norma Grimsey third lady in 46.57 and Bernie Hercock 55.52.

Other performances on 6th October included a Dutch 50km win for Dan King in 4.05.36 and in the same race a 5.40.25 performance from Barnet's Steve Allen and in the South Bucks 10km Run Barbara Ralph recorded 47.32 and husband John who walked it 58.52

2014 London Marathon

John Ralph has informed me that he has been allocated an EHAC London marathon entry. John has run in the race on ten occasions, his fastest being 2.40.31 in 1991, the same year that wife Barbara clocked her best of 3.05.30. I'd be interested to hear from any other ERWL regulars who have had entries accepted.
