Junior Championships Hat Trick

Callum Wilkinson signed off his 2014 championship campaign with a resounding victory in the English Schools 5km walk staged at Boston, Lincs, on Saturday 20th Sept. In perfect conditions; overcast, cool and only a slight breeze, he completely outclassed his rivals finishing 300m ahead of the field.

Lapping at sub seven minute mile pace Wilkinson's opening kilometre took just 4.17 followed by a 4.15 and a 4.16 to pass 3km in 12.48, which was too quick for Alex Eaton (IoM) last year's winner and Kent's Cameron Corbishley who just had to give ground to the EHAC athlete..

Barring intervention from the judges the championship was assured and the possibility of breaking the long standing championship best performance became the goal. Quickening his pace Callum covered the fourth km in 4.03 and the last in 4.01 to clock an outstanding 20.52 – eight seconds better than the twenty-one year old record!

This victory tagged on to his UKA/RWA u20 10km road, and EA 10km track championships, completed a clean sweep of the three national junior titles staged in 2014.

Commonwealth Games Luncheon

Two years after the successful Olympic Games Luncheon to salute the country's Race Walk Olympians another was held to do the same to those who had competed in the Commonwealth Games since their inception at Jamaica in 1966. The venue was the same; The Thistle Tower Hotel, London and the gathering took place on Saturday 13th September. Among the one hundred and Thirty-five who attended, were representatives from England, Guernsey, Isle of Man, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. It was a nostalgic occasion and as the winner of the inaugural race in Kingston forty-eight years ago, particularly so for me. Despite the omission of walks in this year's Glasgow Games, the assurance from Australia that they will be included in the next edition to be staged by them in 2018 encouraged an air of confidence at the function and about race walking's future.

All credit must go to the RWA for promoting the event and to the principal organisers Peter Marlow, Pam Ficken and Dave Ainsworth for enabling it to happen.

Roubaix Report from Cath Duhig

In the relays we had "The Lightning Ladies", who were Kathy Crilley, Chris Flint (?!?!?!?) and myself. Chris replaced Norma who had broken her wrist – if she'd been there we would have been first female team, but we had a job passing Chris off as a woman so had to settle for 3rd place (5th team overall) in the Mixed category. We covered 186Km 927m, which wasn't so far off previous totals considering my injury and the fact that I'd not walked more than 20 mins at a stretch in months (I did about 65K in the 24 hour period, that's nearly a year's mileage on recent form!)

"The Thunderbolts", – Serena Queeney, Sue Rey and Liz Blakie -clocked up 168km 041m in 8th team place, 2nd all female team. It has fired Liz up a bit to try some League races in the coming season, as one of her daughters is lodging in Mile End for the coming academic year and we have persuaded Liz she can combine visiting Katherine with doing a few ERWL races.

The weather was pretty good overall though we had a mighty storm at about 8pm on Saturday which rather dampened spirits, as well as everything else, for a while, and another spell of rain about 12 hours

later, leaving everyone a bit chilled for the morning stint. Overnight was relatively mild though, and things cleared up enough later for us to be able to pack away tentage, etc relatively dry.

Among the 49 Individuals taking part was Suzanne Beardsmore (Abingdon) for whom it was still a bit of a bridge too far following surgery, but she completed enough to count in the prize list , covering 140Km 597m in 45th (14th F) 49 finished. A very pleasant weekend overall!

The entry of four women and four men for the **BMAF track 10km championship** at Birmingham on 21st September was possibly the lowest ever. The road version of this championship was incorporated in the Jim Sharlott meeting at Leicester only a fortnight before and perhaps this was a contributing factor to the poor entry. There were no club walkers in the race, but *ERWL* supporters will recognize familiar names on the finishing sheet: Steve Allen (M55) 56.46, Malc Martin (M55) 57.14, Peter Boszko (M65) 59.25, Ken Bobbett (M70) 63.22, Noel Blatchford (W65) 67.07, Angela Martin (W50) 73.15, Naomi Shama (W45) 74.16, Sandra Campbell (W45).

The opening SWC fixture the **Gazette Cup 4 miles**, traditionally held on the first Saturday in October was, because of the staging of the National 50km on that Saturday this year, brought forward to 28th September. Luc Legon fresh from his English School's u17 victory the previous week enjoyed a comfortable win over the far from flat course at Addiscombe. His time of 34.02 took him well clear of Malc Martin 35.37 although it's worth noting that Malc had raced at Hemel Hempstead the day before. David Crane 36.05, a notable absentee from events this year demonstrated that he has retained his fitness, whilst Dan Maskell 40.28, Paul King 41.58, Peter Hannell 43.22, Peter Crane 45.36 and David Delaney 45.52 were *Leaguers* who took part. Three women were among the fifteen walkers and two of them Angela Martin 45.23 and Sandra Campbell 49.35 competed the day before and they were spilt by Geraldine Legon 47.32.
