



## The 22<sup>nd</sup> ERWL Edition Gets Underway

The opening race staged at Donkey Lane was held in dry overcast conditions with the temperature around 10c and was dominated by Dave Annetts who had a huge winning margin. He had close attendance from Maddy Shott and George Wilkinson for the first couple of miles then walked away from them. Nevertheless, the performance of Maddy Shott, who gained her first international selection following her win at the EA Indoor championships the previous week, confirms her progress in the discipline.

A feature of the race was the fine showing of the four Kent ladies who made the lengthy journey from south of the river and all of whom easily qualified for their “5 in the Hour” badges as indeed did Ilford’s Emma Dyos.

It was good to see former League champions Anne and Trevor Jones at the event, the latter showing that he has not lost the action to travel at a decent pace.

The number of participants was six down on down 2018, but the standard considerably higher. Last year 12 walkers (8 men and 4 women) bettered 50 minutes and this year it was 15 (8 and 7). In 2018 25 walkers bettered the hour, this year it was 29. The young ladies from Kent not only brought the times down, but also the average age of the competitors.

Centurion and Enfield stalwart Ken Livermore presented the awards for the 2018 season among them “The Officials Trophy” to John Hall in recognition for his unstinting services, often behind the scenes to the ERWL as well as racing whenever he can.

## Outstanding Results from 2018

There were two Leaguers among the 16 walkers who turned out in the Lancashire WC's **Dick Maxwell Memorial 10km** at Simister on 1<sup>st</sup> December. They were; Tony Bell (LWC/L) 3<sup>rd</sup> 63.32 and Dan Maskell (SWC/L) 8<sup>th</sup> 66.5. Adrian Edwards of the promoting club was the race winner in 57.59.

There were an encouraging number of 23 young walkers among the 39 who raced at the annual **Alf Palmer Memorial track races** at Horsham on 9<sup>th</sup> December. In contrast to last year, when conditions prompted the cancellation of the event, on this occasion they were good. In the men's 5km Luc Legon (Cambs H) 23.44, Jimmy Ball (Steyning AC) 27.50 and Malcolm Martin (Surrey WC/L) 29.35 were the first three men to finish. Arthur Thomson (EHAC/L) 9<sup>th</sup> 34.23 along with Chris Flint 10<sup>th</sup> 34.24, Shaun Lightman 11<sup>th</sup> 35.39 and David Hoben 12<sup>th</sup> 37.01 (all Surrey WC/L) also raced. In the Ladies event Lois Carty (AFD) 28.48 was the winner with two Leaguers; Melanie Peddle (Loughton AC/L) 5<sup>th</sup> in 30.43 and Geraldine Legon (Bexley AC/L) 8<sup>th</sup> in 34.21.



*Newcomers to race walking may not be aware that Pam Ficken's father Hew Neilson c145 was a giant among ultra-distance walkers in the late fifties and 1960's when competition at the distance was so fierce that sub 20 hours couldn't always guarantee a place in the top six positions. He was a three-time winner of the UK 100 miles title, but is probably best remembered for his performance in the invitation 24 hour track race at Walton on Thames over the weekend of 14<sup>th</sup>/15<sup>th</sup> October 1960 when in autumnal conditions on a shale track he re-wrote the distance record book, passing 100 miles in 17.18.51 and going on to set a world record of 133 miles 21 yards for 24 hours.*
