

JOHN BORGARS Brilliantly and Well Done!

Leaguer John Borgars (Loughton AC) qualified as a member of the Centurion brotherhood by walking one hundred miles in 22.31.52 in the Redcar 100 on 6th/7th August.

At 70 years of age it is thought that he Centurion number 1170, is the oldest person to qualify and to add to that, he was also third in the RWA national Long Distance championship.

John, being congratulated by RWA President Fred Pearce, just moments after completing his 100 miles at Redcar on $6^{th}/7^{th}$ August. Also in the picture is John's wife Ruth and in the background in the orange jacket is a smiling Pauline Wilson the only other Loughton AC first claim Centurion.

Race winner was Dutchman Frank vd Guilik in 20.30. Second and RWA national champion was The Association's Hon Secretary Colin Vesty 20.39.44 and runner up was (in 4th ovrall) Kevin Marshall in 22.02.15. The leading lady was Sandra Brown 21.10.06. Full report on the Centurions 1911 website.

Results Round-up

In ideal conditions the final race of the **2016 Vets AC** summer 5 mile series at Battersea Park on 16th August was won by Mark Culshaw in 48.57 and among the other ten who turned out were ERWL regulars Maureen Noel (1st lady) 52.37, Arthur Thomson 53.23, Michael Harran 54.19 and David Hoben 58.25.

On the same evening over at Ashton Playing Fields track it was the penultimate race of the **Woodford 3km Tuesday** evening series and sadly only four walkers toed the line. They were new Centurion John Borgars 19.22, Pamela Abbott 20.19, Sean Pender 20.48 and Peter Cassidy 21.17.

England Athletics included a **3km walk in their Manchester International** meeting staged on 17th August built around a three way match involving England, GB Juniors and the BAL/UKWL teams and guest competitors. Callum Wilkinson 11.49 was a comfortable winner ahead of Guy Thomas 12.08 and Cameron Corbishley 12.19. Bethan Davies 13.04 was the first female across the line in 13.04, followed by Gemma Bridge 13.17 and Tatyana Gabellone 13.23. In all, 19 walkers were in action at the meeting.

A Busy Bank Holiday Weekend – 6 races in 4 days

In addition to the ERWL/LICC race at Allianz Park on Saturday 27th August (result page 2), there was another race and in the ensuing three days the following races took place:

On the same day Dan King won the **Essex CAA 10km track championship** at Garon Park, Southend. His time was a sedate 47.17 which was not surprising with the lack of competition. The only other walker was Bob Dobson 71.03 who had travelled all the way from Cardiff to support the event.

The following day, Sunday 28th August, the **England Athletics under 15/17 championships** were held at Bedford. The 10.20am start time meant that conditions for the 11 competitors were ideal; cool and cloudy. Of particular interest to the ERWL was George Wilkinson's pb of 17.46 in the u15 Boys 3km, a race won by Jack Childs (Medway) in 17.04. The other champions were: under 15 Girl's 3km Lucy Lewis-Ward (Cambridge H), under 17 women's 5km Ana Garcia (City of Sheffield) and the men's 5km Chris Snook (Aldershot AFD).

Also on the same day, Club and ERWL athletes were in action at Kingston, Kings Meadow in the VAC & SVAC track championships. The distance was 3km and the walkers were Penelope Cummings 18.08, John Ralph 19.23, Fiona Bishop 18.56 and Peter Hannell 19.23.

Garon track was in use again on Monday 30th August for **Southend AC's annual meeting** which included a mile walk. An excellent field of 23 completed the race and Olympian Dominic King obliterated the meeting and track record with a sizzling 6.11.06 and earned himself the George Woods trophy awarded to the first Essex based Centurion in this race. Among Leaguers who took part were Stephen Cartwright 9.47, John Borgars 9.52, Michael Harran 10.06, Steve Allen © 10.35, Alan O'Rawe 10.54, Peter Cassidy10.57, Dave Hoben 11.00 and Dave Ainsworth 12.40. Interestingly, in third place with 9.39 was former international George Nibre who clocked a 4.16.47 50km in 1980.

The final race of the 2016 **Woodford Tuesday 3km** series took place on Tuesday 31st August and was won by Mark Culshaw in 16.30. Only two of the nine strong field didn't have Club or ERWL connections and they occupied the minor placings; promising Cambridge Harrier Alex MacHeath (u13) second in 16.36 and Steve Allen third in 17.15. John Borgars 18.54, Sean Pender 20.40, Pamela Abbott 20.41 Peter Cassidy 20.57 and Dave Ainsworth 24.52 were the other competitors. The series winners were: Steve Allen, Melanie Peddle and Loughton AC. EHAC were second of the seven teams, whilst Pamela Abbott was second lady and Sean Pender third man.

Race Walks were included in the programme at the **Youth Development** meeting staged At Bedford on Saturday 3rd September and 20 youngsters from u13's to u17's went to the start lines at either 1km or 2km . For the u15's the awards went in the same order, to the same three who came out on top in the EA championships a week earlier, however this time it was a much closer contest; Jack Childs 5.04, Hisham Alkhamesi 5.06 and George Wilkinson 5.09.

Jim Sharlott/BMAF 10km – 3rd September. On a rainy day in Abbey Park, pre-race favourite Francisco Reis missed the start leaving the way open for Mark Williams (M50) 52.26 to regain the title he last won in 2012. Leicester's Dwayne Butterly (M50) 54.16 had stayed with Williams in the early part of the race, but faded somewhat towards the end and managed to hold on for second place. Peter Boszko (M65) 59.34 held off Graham Chapman (M60) 59.41 for 3rd place by just 7 seconds. Graham's effort was rewarded by a first place medal in his BMAF age group.

Enfield's super Vet Arthur Thomson M80 won his umpteenth BMAF title and other BMAF medal performances of ERWL interest were; Mark Culshaw (M50) 3rd 60.00, Shaun Lightman (M70) 2nd 66.39, John Borgars (M70) 66.41 and Fiona Bishop (W55) 1st 65.51 a time that with her allowance, won her the open handicap prize.

The annual **Guernsey Church to Church 19.4 miles walk** on was won by Manxman Sam Fletcher in 3.07.45 with Jim Ball 3.12.47 and Stuart LeNoury 3.18.09 taking second and third places. The club was represented by Sean Pender 7th of the 18 finishers in 3.45.19 and *Leaguer* Dave Hoben who also competed in the warm-up 3km race two days before was 14th in 4.07.41. The 3km was won by Stuart LeNoury in 14.58 and Dave was 10th of 14 in 20.56.

The club had two representatives in the **Lancashire WC 2 hour** track race at Bury, Lancashire on Saturday 10th September. TLWC put the event on to mark the 45th anniversary of my national 2 hour record and the half Century anniversary of my Commonwealth & Empire Games victory. There were 20 starters of which 13 went on to complete 2 hours among them Sean Pender and Myself. The winner was Roy Gunnett 17.498km and only 63 metres behind was Sean Pender 17.435km. I was 12th with 12.390km, less than half the distance I did when setting the record.

Message from Callum Wilkinson I have decided to officially end my season as of today (mid Augst) and won't be competing in an autumn 20km as I had planned. This now marks the end of my junior career and I have been lucky enough to travel to some incredible places and meet some amazing people.

This season has shown me what I am capable of. I have achieved all I could have hoped for and am the proud holder of all junior British records as well as the World Junior Champion. I am so blessed to be able to do something I love and will never take this for granted.

Finally, I want to say a massive thank you to all who support me and hope will continue to do so. Four year from novice to junior world champion, I'm so excited for what the next four years may hold.
